Prerequisite: French 10

French 20 balances oral and written French equally and is based on a thematic communicative/experiential approach. This course enables students to practice spoken French in communicative situations and puts more emphasis on creating and sustaining conversations with peers. The principle broad-based theme of study is treasures and memories. We publish our very own children books and bring them over to an elementary school and read them to grade ones. Another project consists of assembling a timeline which includes some highlights of childhood, favourite activities, toys, a memorable moment and family celebrations and traditions. Throughout the semester students will be introduced to new verb tenses and will expand on their previous vocabulary and grammar skills.
